
### Films at Film Festival



#### Tanzania - Mozambique and Tanzania sign defence deals - 4 day official visit




Tanzania's President Samia Suluhu Hassan, 1 year in office

President of Mozambique - Filipe Jacinto Nyusi Since 2015 Chairman of Southern African Development Community since August 2020

- 2 cooperation agreements in Maputo with a focus on combating terrorism and fighting crime.
- Mozambique is currently fighting Islamist militants in the gas-rich northern Cabo Delgado region of the country.
- President Nyusi said the two countries were currently focused on the exploitation of hydrocarbons which form the building blocks of vital energy sources like coal and gas.
- President Samia also highlighted the need for both countries to strengthen security because of the extensive common border they share

#### Tanzania – Bid for Oscars

- Vuta N'kuvute film Swahili for tug of war

## MZEE WILLIAM KYEYAMWA – 102 YEARS YOUNG (WAKO HSE 1935-1942)\* is our Oldest MOBA Life Member





William Kyeyamwa is a retired Senior Medical Assistant born on December 26,1920. Between 1928 – 1934, he attended Kiyunga Primary School. In 1935, him and Balodha Mufumba were the only two candidates from Luuka County who won the Busoga Kingdom bursary to study at Busoga College Mwiri. They stayed in the Junior Secondary section for 3 years. Later, William joined Wako House for his 4-year Senior Secondary education which he completed in 1942. He was a formidable striker in the school football team. He recalls that the current Wako house is a greater improvement from the original. He also recalls that while collecting stones for constructing the terrace, the boys captured a huge python and their teacher Rev F.G Coates ordered that it be skinned. The meat was chopped up, spiced and roasted. To entice the boys, Rev Coates first munched away a chunk of meat and explained to the boys that such amount of protein should never be allowed to go to waste. The boys ate the meat

After 2 years of vocational employment as a nursing aid, in 1945 William joined Mulago Medical School where he graduated as a Medical Assistant in 1949. He initially worked at Mulago Hospital before being posted to Soroti hospital in 1952 and later Kaberamaido hospital in 1954. From Kaberamaido he was posted to jinja hospital in 1956 where he served and rose to the rank of Senior Medical Assistant. In between he worked at Namasagali Health facility for 1 year. In 1969 he joined Jinja Municipal Council in charge of Walukuba Health Centre from where he retired from Civil Service 1984. Upon retirement he went into private business managing Total petrol station on Main Street Jinja, a Dairy farm at Musita Iganga and Real Estate businesses.

William also served as a certified Eastern Region Football Referee between 1951 and 1972.

At present, he has difficulty hearing and poor memory. He spends most of his time at his home in Bugembe sleeping or listening to the radio. However, his physical condition remains good.

- Clare Polet drew our attention to the latest Ebola Outbreak in Uganda
  - The 5<sup>th</sup> outbreak of the Sudan virus
  - Started in rural central Uganda
  - As of 12 October 2022, there were a total of 64 confirmed cases and 29 deaths
  - First deaths now reported in Kampala (24/10)

## Ebola Outbreak in Uganda

- Pat Holder spoke about the excellent record of Uganda in dealing with past outbreaks, giving confidence that the current one will be brought under control.
- The protocols the country had in place for Ebola had served it well with the Covid epidemic.
- She also said that her adopted daughter (a social worker in Kampala) had reported a large increase in teenage pregnancies due to the school closures caused by Covid.

## Vaccine Capability in Africa

- Sheila spoke to us about the initiative to tackle vaccine inequity by building up African capacity to innovate as well as manufacture new ones. So far the mRNA hub in Cape Town has been set up successfully, initially working on a COVID vaccine but aiming to try other mRNA vaccines to target TB and malaria. But the key part is to share all the know-how freely to centres in other countries, unlike the restrictive attitude of companies like Moderna over patents and other IP rights.
